



10-YEAR SUMMER DROWNING SNAPSHOT (2013/14 TO 2023/24) Christmas & New Years' holiday week

Between 25th December and 1st January (inclusive)





- Last summer (2023/24), 26% of total drowning in summer occurred during this one week
- The highest number of people drown on the two public holidays
 Christmas Day (25th December), following by Boxing Day (26th December)




Who is most at risk?

During the Christmas and New Year holiday period:

- 24% were aged 55 year and over
- 21% were aged 25 34 years
- 39% of drowning deaths were of migrants
- 25% of drowning deaths had alcohol present

Activity - Other includes includes bathing, rescue, jumped in, fishing and rock fishing, swept away and swept in.

Location - Other includes bathtub, pond, storm drains
