> Forum Introduction

Welcome to the South East Queensland Water Safety Forum 2023

Your attendance reinforces your commitment to working together to shape strategies to address drowning in the region which we all share concern for. We meet at a critical juncture.

More than 366 people have drowned in the region in the last 10 years. 30 per cent of these drowning deaths occurred in rivers and creeks, 25 per cent on beaches and 18 per cent in swimming pools.

Too many of these drowning deaths were local, were men and involved excessive alcohol consumption.

Additionally, there are challenges in water safety education: we are all concerned about the risks of generational impact of the pandemic, compounding already concerning gaps in children's swimming abilities.

These challenges are all interconnected. Without collaboration we cannot expect to meet the Australian Water Safety Strategy 2030 goal of reducing drowning by 50 per cent by 2030.

We know that a range of community, industry and government partners have a role to play in reducing drowning, keeping the community safe and facilitating safe enjoyment of waterways. We also know that the community themselves have an important role to play in creating and sustaining cultural change.

The South East Queensland Water Safety Forum at which we are gathered is unique. The Forum brings together more than 150 respected and experienced leaders in policy, emergency management, aquatic safety, education and research, all to address key issues.

Together we will share ideas, information and develop solutions. The forum is delivered in two streams:

- A Drowning Prevention Planning stream which focuses on the development of a multidisciplinary drowning prevention plan with contribution from a number of sectors and groups
- An Aquatic Facility Safety stream will bring together leaders from aquatic facilities and swim schools across South East Queensland with the aim of sharing best practices in aquatic facility safety and risk management.

Together this week we can transform wicked problems into a more unified path which address these challenges, and the emerging threats they present, to work towards our overall goal, which is preventing drowning. We hope to reach consensus by the close of the Forum on Tuesday on a collective strategy which will drive our efforts to save lives and ensure everyone can enjoy the water safely.

I encourage you to be open, engaged and focused on a collective outcome.
